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### I. Introduction

In the event of a natural disaster, veterinarians and veterinary support staff are uniquely qualified to provide the clinical skills, equipment and supplies in the rescue and treatment of pets, horses, livestock and wildlife. The Minnesota Veterinary Medical Association (MVMA) is organizing veterinary resources on a regional basis (Appendix A) and developing this disaster resource guide for each region in Minnesota. The guide will be completed by the designated Veterinary Disaster Coordinator whose main responsibilities are outlined in this guide.

Each region in Minnesota will receive a guide for their Veterinary Coordinator to complete. A copy of the completed guide for each region will be housed at the MVMA headquarters in St. Paul in the event of loss or damage to the original guide. Also, a copy of the completed guide will be sent to the local agencies that will be actively responding to disasters and will provide them an organized list of veterinary related resources.

The intent of this guide is to organize veterinary resources and provide mechanisms for those resources to be used within the existing plans for disaster response. It is unlikely that veterinarians will be first respondents in a disaster, and it is imperative that we work within the existing incident command system for the particular disaster. Through training, organization and coordination with agencies involved in each disaster, Minnesota veterinarians can contribute immensely to animal welfare.

This guide was prepared by the MVMA MNVMRC/Disaster Response Committee.

### Statement of Purpose-MNVMRC/Disaster Response Committee

To oversee the MNVMRC, develop training tools for MNVMRC members, to develop an annex to the Minnesota Emergency Operations Plan and expand the working relationships with neighboring states in order to facilitate veterinary response teams that may be deployed in emergencies or disasters. ### II. How to Use This Guide

- 1. The responsibilities of the Regional Veterinary Coordinator are outlined in Section III of the Disaster Guide. The following steps detail how to use this guide to accumulate resources prior to a disaster.
- 2. Please make copies of all pages which have the following noted at the bottom: "Please copy as many extra blank pages as needed prior to filling out above." Please make plenty of extra copies and **avoid using the original page**.
- 3. The Veterinary Coordinator will send the Disaster Resource Survey (Appendix D) to all veterinarians and veterinary technicians in the Coordinator's region.
- 4. Send Animal Care and Holding Surveys (Appendix C) to all veterinary hospitals, shelters, kennels, etc in your region to develop the resources for Section VII. Place completed surveys in Section VII.
- 5. Retype the Model Letter to Organizations (Appendix B) on your letterhead or MVMA letterhead and send to the appropriate agencies and organizations in your region that may assist veterinarians in caring for animals during a disaster. Please record each letter sent and received. For ideas or addresses of local agencies, see Section III and contact the state agency or regional office for information.
- 6. Send a letter to the phone company and follow up with a telephone call. This will ensure that the phone line at the designated "command post" will be open during a disaster.
- 7. Contact Local Disaster Resources and fill in Section IV.
- 8. Add all returned surveys to your guide and complete as many sections of the guide as practical in your region. Send a quality copy of your completed guide to the MVMA. The MVMA will store the copy at the St. Paul office and will also make as many copies as you need to distribute to local agencies and organizations that you have identified (please include names, addresses and phone numbers of the organizations selected). If the original copy is lost or damaged, call the MVMA office or MNVMRC coordinator for another copy.
- 9. Please acknowledge all copyrights (see Acknowledgements).
- 10. Thank you for donating your valuable time to the disaster effort!

### Responsibilities:

- 1. Select regional veterinary coordinators.
- 2. Assist in the update of the MVMA/MNRMVC Disaster Response Resource Guide annually.
- 3. Help develop training programs for veterinarians to become certified disaster workers covered by state insurance.
- 4. Help develop continuing education training for MNVMRC members.
- 5. Initiate contact with other agencies and organizations involved with disaster planning.
- 6. Initiate contact with neighboring states within EMAC to develop a network of certified disaster workers.
- 7. Prepare committee agenda, moderate committee meetings and maintain committee meeting minutes.
- 8. Prepare committee reports for MVMA board meetings.
- 9. Will be responsible for all MNVMRC State Coordinator responsibilities until a coordinator is appointed.

### B. State MNVMRC Coordinator Kathy Jorgensen, DVM, MPH, DACVPM

### Responsibilities:

- 1. Maintain communication with each regional coordinator.
- 2. Assist in the update of the MVMA/MNVMRC Disaster Response Resource Guide annually.
- 3. Collect reports from Regional Coordinators to document veterinary care during a disaster.
- 4. Study veterinary response and coordination following each disaster to modify the Guide to create a more efficient manual.
- 5. Help develop training programs for veterinarians to become certified disaster workers covered by state insurance.
- 6. Help develop continuing education for MNVMRC members.
- 7. Maintain contact with agencies and organizations involved with disaster planning.
- 8. Maintain contact with neighboring states and regularly reassess infrastructure, issues and needs.
- 9. Prepare committee reports and give updates at board meetings.

### Responsibilities:

Work Address

- 1. The Regional MNVMRC Coordinator will send out and collect the Disaster Resource Survey to all veterinarians and veterinary technicians within the region.
- 2. The Coordinator is designated to complete the regional guide and send a copy of the guide to the MVMA. The MVMA will keep one copy for backup reference and will reproduce copies for the Coordinators to distribute to the appropriate agency contacts.
- 3. During and emergency, the Coordinator will serve as the resource contact for all agencies, veterinarians, media and animal owners. The Coordinator will arrange to have his or her phone line on the phone company's list to be kept open during a disaster.
- 4. The Coordinator should be available at all times to respond to disasters by phone. In the event the Coordinator will not available, the State Coordinator should be informed so alternate plans can be made.
- 5. The Coordinators will serve on the MVMA MNVMRC/Disaster Response Committee.
- 6. The Coordinator shall attend appropriate media training.
- 7. The Coordinator should encourage veterinary personnel within the region to complete the Disaster Resource Survey and participate in disaster preparedness.
- 8. The Coordinator should have access to current maps of his or her region and locations of veterinary clinics within the region.
- 9. Select a "Command Post" (designated meeting place) with communications and a phone line that will be open during a disaster by prior arrangement with the phone company and/or county emergency management. Alternate command post sites may need to be considered on a county-by-county basis.

- 10. Triage-determine which needs are most important, which areas and species of animals are involved, which supplies are needed and transportation available.
- 11. In the case of a prolonged event, the Coordinator will conduct staff meetings to assess the changing veterinary needs during a disaster.
- 12. Disaster training will be provided by MNVMRC. Training will be strongly encouraged for all participants in the disaster preparedness program. Veterinarians will not be able to cross into areas declared off limits by the government unless they have been credentialed as a certified disaster worker prior.
- 13. Create a Pet Hotline if possible. Give this number to your media spokesperson to be released to the media during a disaster.
- 14. Work closely with local Red Cross and Humane Groups. The Coordinator may also join the disaster committee of the organization(s).

# VIII. Animal Care and Holding Facilities

Introduction: Animal holding facilities are the most valuable resource in a disaster or emergency. A triage system must be implemented to transport animals needing veterinary care to veterinary hospitals and healthy but lost animals to shelters, kennels, etc. Animal identification during transport and holding is essential. Standardized medical records must be kept on all animals treated during the disaster (Appendices E and G). Depending on the number of injured animals, veterinary hospitals may also be used as boarding facilities until the owners can be located and have a place for their pet.

Please contact veterinarians, kennel operators, animal control facilities and other interested parties in your region that may be able to provide animal sheltering during a disaster. Make copies of the Animal Care and Holding Survey in Appendix C and send the survey to facility owners to develop a list of holding areas and treatment areas for animals during a disaster. This will be valuable information regarding the capacity and capabilities of each facility. Record all contracts and offers for space and keep records in the guide. Animal identification during treatment and holding is essential.



#### XI. Coordinator Checklist (What to do in the event of a disaster)

- ✓ Meet at a designated "command post." Coordinators may consider designating a specific command post in each county of their respective regions. Prearrange those members of the disaster team to meet automatically at command post if unable to contact or activate by the normal channels.
- ✓ Assess extent of disaster and plan to work in the least affected area. This may require moving the command post and setting up alternative communications systems.
- ✓ Form and plan for disaster. This may include:
  - a. Map of the affected area
  - b. Outline number of veterinary hospitals affected
  - c. Outline number of veterinary hospitals that may be needed to aid in treatment and sheltering of affected animals
  - d. Assess transportation needs and list resources to call
  - e. Identify liaisons to communicate resources and needs of veterinarians during the disaster to the incident commander for the disaster
  - f. Contact American Red Cross and locate Red Cross Shelters. Coordinate transportation from shelters to veterinary clinics.
  - g. Prepare for any situation that may be specific to your local area
- ✓ A communications liaison to develop alternative communications if phone lines or cellular towers are not operating. Prior contact with County Emergency Management Directors may be beneficial.
- ✓ Designate a Logistics Specialist to organize supplies and call appropriate resources to arrange deliveries.
- ✓ Send out trained and certified personnel to assess animal needs during a disaster. A good relationship with local agencies prior to the disaster may facilitate entrance into a closed area. Credentials do not ensure automatic access to a disaster zone.
- ✓ Formulate a safety plan and always review hazards prior to embarking on disaster assessments.
- ✓ Make up reasonable shift schedules for all volunteers and members of the veterinary disaster team. Refer staff to appropriate counseling if stress or fatigue are severe.
- ✓ Contact local humane organizations as they already may be coordinated with Red Cross shelters for animal pickup.

#### Appendix K

#### Client Education Handout

#### Disaster Planning for Your Pet

Note: Pets are not allowed inside emergency public shelters due to public health and safety reasons

#### PLAN AHEAD!!!!!

#### Before a disaster:

- Acquire a pet carrier or crate for each house pet if you plan to travel. These carriers should be large enough for the pet to stand up and turn around. Take time to familiarize your pet with the portable kennel.
- Be sure your pet's vaccinations are up-to-date. This is especially important if you plan to board your pet since most boarding facilities require proof of current vaccinations.
- Be sure your pet wears a properly fitted collar and a current identification at all times. Keep an extra leash on hand with the pet's carrier.
- Survey your home to determine the best location away from windows to place your pet during an emergency.
- Make phone calls to determine your options should it ever become necessary to leave your home. If you plan to use an emergency public shelter, you should make other arrangements for your pet's protection and safety such as:
  - 1. Survey boarding kennels. Note their locations and find out if there is a plan in place should the kennel need to be evacuated.
  - 2. Survey local veterinary facilities to determine which clinics offer boarding facilities.
  - 3. Ask dependable friends or relatives if you and/or your pets could stay with them during an emergency.
  - 4. Call motels if you plan to leave your house and take your pet with you upon evacuation. Websites such as <a href="http://petswelcome.com">http://petswelcome.com</a> have listings of hotel chains that accept pets.

#### At the time of the disaster:

- Acquire ample quantities of pet food, cat litter, etc. when purchasing your other disaster supplies.
- Acquire plenty of newspaper, plastic bags and cleanser/disinfectants to handle pet waste.

#### If you plan to leave your residence and leave your pet(s) behind:

- Prepare an area for your pet to use inside the house away from windows and in an area that is easy to clean.
- Bring your pet indoors well ahead of the emergency or disaster.
- Do not leave your pet tied up outside during inclement weather.

- Leave only dry type foods and use sturdy food containers.
- Do not leave any treat type supplements. Overeating of these may cause toxicity if too much is consumed.
- Birds must eat daily to survive. Use special food dispensers if you must leave them behind.
- Water for pets should be left in bathtubs or in containers that will not spill.
- If the animals are on special diets and medication, plan ahead by consulting with your veterinarian.
- Never leave a cat with a dog even if they are usually friendly.
- Confine and keep small pets (birds, hamsters, etc.) away from cats and dogs.
- Provide access to high places such as counter tops in case flooding occurs.
- Difficult or dangerous animals should be left in special cages on top of the counter to reduce the possibility of them getting loose.

# If you plan to leave the area and take your pet with you, the following items should be prepared:

- License or identification and rabies tags/certificate
- Non-spill water and food bowls
- Newspapers and/or paper towels
- Leashes, harnesses, etc.
- Water in sanitized and non-breakable containers, dried or packaged semi-moist foods
- Special diets or medications

#### After the disaster:

Be careful when allowing your pets outdoors after the disaster has passed. Familiar scents and landmarks may be altered, and your pet could easily become confused or lost. Downed power lines and other hazardous materials could present dangers to your pets.
